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## Free School Meals/Pupil Premium Funding

As a School, we receive a Pupil Premium allocation for each child who is entitled to receive Free School Meals. The intended effect of this funding is to accelerate progress and raise attainment. The Pupil Premium exists to ensure that no child is disadvantaged.

If you are in receipt of any of the following, your child may be eligible for free school meals:

- Universal Credit (annual net income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support, income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or income-based Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying)

If you believe that your family is in receipt of qualifying benefits, that may mean that you are entitled to register and our school will receive pupil premium funding to benefit your child educationally. For more information and details of how to apply, please visit:

**Please note**: Although Reception, Year 1 and 2 children are universally entitled to free school meals, they are not automatically placed on the register. Children must still register with North Northamptonshire Council to ensure that they are entitled to support with other areas of school life.

If your child is eligible for the Pupil Premium and this is confirmed by North Northamptonshire Council, the school will fund:

- 50% of the cost of school trips and events, with some funded for free
- The school will pay for access to learn to 1 x music instrument (either through Rocksteady or NMPAT) for as long as they are entitled to PP
- The provision of 1 x school jumper each year
- Access to Free School Meals (for children in Year 3 and above)

## Grow your own CHIPS

#### How it works;

Obtain some soil and or compost and plant the potato in the bucket by the 1st May.

Water and feed your potato regularly and watch it grow.

Then on the day of the show bring your bucket with the potatoes in to the Church hall and

we will tip them out and record the weight of the potatoes.

The person that grows the greatest weight from the single seed potato wins the competition.

As a second prize, the person who grows the largest potato can have it turned into chips for them to eat.



All participants can keep their potatoes and take them home to enjoy later.
